## *Splurging*

Enjoy a leisurely afternoon ice cream at Greer staple, Dillard's Farms Ice Cream Parlor. On a warm afternoon expect the lines to be long, but the wait to be worthwhile. We highly recommend the peach ice cream with freshly picked peaches. Not in the mood for ice cream? Pick up some fresh seasonal produce in their market.

## *Learning*

## *Dining*

Indulge at OpenTable's number one restaurant in South Carolina, Bin 112. The 2014 Upstate Restaurateur of the Year, Chef Jason Clark also feature several specialties on his menu, including the Flaming Kasserli (its called that for a reason) and Dim Sum.

## *History*

Added to the National Registry of Historic Places in 2009, Campbell's Covered Bridge is the only covered bridge left in South Carolina. Since being restored for a second time in 1990, the picturesque park is the perfect stop for a lunchtime picnic or photo opportunity.
